IALEIA is pleased to announce the availability of a \$1,000.00 scholarship for eligible IALEIA members and their immediate family. **IALEIA** members in good standing are eligible to apply directly to **IALEIA**.

The scholarship is named after the memory of Jorge Espejel-Contreras, former Mexico Chapter President who passed away in January 2007. Jorge was the 2006 IALEIA recipient of the award "To the individual for service to the cause of law enforcement intelligence analysis". Jorge was a brave and honest man who cared so much for his country and his profession. He inspired many with his integrity and his sincerity, and showed tremendous dedication.

All instructions and application material are available on the IALEIA website. All applicants for this scholarship must meet eligibility requirements to pursue approved academic coursework with an accredited academic institution. Please see the attached guidelines for further details.

Eligible **IALEIA** members should be enrolled in an intelligence, analysis, statistics, criminal justice or other related undergraduate or graduate program at an accredited academic institution, however, other majors will be considered. The focus of the essay will be on **The Future of Law Enforcement Intelligence as a Profession**

All applications, and required essay for this scholarship should be received no later than close of business, Friday, March 30, 2007. Please email your completed material to jimenez@ialeia.org, with a signed original copy mailed to the address indicated in the application and program description.

All decisions by the **IALEIA** Training, Education, and Career Development Committee are final. The winner of the **IALEIA** scholarship will be notified in advance and will be announced at the IALEIA Annual Conference in Vancouver, Canada on April 26, 2007. The winner will also be announced on the **IALEIA** web page, a future edition of the **IALEIA** Intelscope, and the winning essay will be featured for publication in the IALEIA Journal. The scholarship will be paid directly to the school. All submissions will become the property of IALEIA and cannot be returned.
